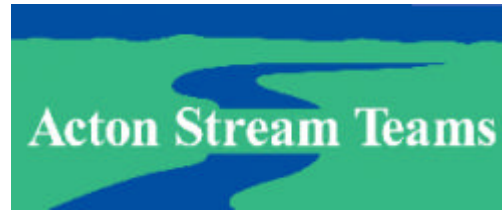


OUTDOOR VOLUNTEERS NEEDED....



*...to periodically take photos,
and make observations of Acton streams.*

Why? To document any changes since the 1998 visual shoreline survey conducted by the Acton Stream Teams, and...

To help the Acton Conservation Commiission distinguish between "perennial" and "intermittent" streams in Acton.

Features	Perennial Streams	Intermittent Streams
Type of Stream Flow	Flow year round, except under drought conditions	Tend to dry up in the summer
Area of Protection per Law	Up to 200 feet from stream edge	Up to 100 feet from stream edge

When? ... at your convenience. Volunteers may visit a stream location just once - or several times over the year. (Photos taken during late summer are especially valuable in determining whether or not a stream is "perennial".)

Where? ... any local stream or waterway, whether or not it was included in the 1998 survey. See the [1998 Shoreline Survey](#). *Volunteers should not access private property unless they have permission to do so.* Good locations for observations are road crossings.
